Uniform Year 7 to 11

- Black blazer with embroidered motif (any colour permitted) to always be worn.
- White shirt.
- Black trousers, tailored and made of non-stretch fabric. No flares or tight-fitting trousers, including leggings, will be permitted. TRNS emblem optional.
- Black skirt, pleated and made of non-stretch fabric to allow movement and no more than 3" above the knee/staff discretion. No short or tight skirts are permitted. TRNS emblem optional.
- Blue v-neck jumper with silver stripe (optional).
- Blue and silver tie.
- Black or white socks, or black, grey or tan tights.
- Sensible black flat shoes, no trainers, boots or canvas shoes.

Accessories, hairstyles, make-up and jewellery

- Extreme haircuts, styles, colours and patterns are not allowed the Headteacher/Senior Leadership's decision is final.
- Expensive items of jewellery, designer coats etc should not be brought onto the school site and the school can take no responsibility for loss or damage.
- No body/facial piercings are allowed in school except for one pair of small studs which may be
 worn in ear lobes. Please note that these must be able to be removed by the student during
 PE lessons, due to health and safety.
- Make up may only be worn by Years 11, 12 and 13.

False eyelashes, coloured nail varnish and nail extensions are also prohibited.

PE Kit – only to be worn in PE lessons

- Navy and silver polo top
- Navy and silver shorts
- Navy and silver socks
- Football boots
- Shin pads
- Sensible training shoes (no boots)
- Navy and silver hooded top (optional)
- Navy and silver reversible long-sleeve top (optional)
- Navy tracksuit bottoms (optional/for outdoor lessons only)
- Navy sports leggings Year 9 girls only. We have made this decision due to mixed lessons sometimes taking place in year 9 and we believe that students would feel more comfortable participating. Leggings must be navy – black leggings are prohibited. Simple sports logos are acceptable.

Please note: If a student has a physical injury, they are still required to bring in their PE kit and get changed. Students will take on another role such as a coach, referee, team manager, or assistant. (Exceptions to this are at the Head of Departments discretion).

Uniform - Sixth Form

- Appropriate footwear no flip flops/sliders/sandals
- Any trousers/shorts/skirts (appropriate length), except ripped clothes
- Any tops with sleeves that cover the midriff and no plunging necklines
- No visible underwear
- No vests
- No headwear of any kind, except of religious dress
- All clothing must not display any offensive wording or political statements
- All uniform is at the Sixth Form Teams' discretion.
