- Students will design their own political party which will include creating a manifesto

- Understanding the terms of conflict and conflict resolution both personally and internationally Investigating international conflict case studies Libya.
- Exploring possible solutions to worldwide conflicts and how international organisations can help play apart in resolution

- Understanding changes to the body
- Exploring the concepts of responsibility and how to stay safe regarding sexual activity
- Investigating choices and ensuring we understand the consequences of our actions

Term 1:

## **Crime in our local area**

- Explore the two types of crime (civil and criminal).
- Investigate crime in our local area and the impacts this can have on our own lives as well as others.

Term 2:

## **Drugs and Alcohol**

- Explore the law surrounding drugs and alcohol.
- Understand the risks associated with drugs.
- How drugs and alcohol can impact mental wellbeing.

Term 3:

## **Economics and financial decisions**

- Understand the different types of tax.
- Consider the positive and negative financial risks.
- Explore the difference between debit and credit.

Term 4

## **Intimate sexual relationships**

- The pressure surrounding sex.
- The positive aspects of sexual relationships.
- Explore the different types of contraception.

Term 5:

## **Physical health and fitness**

- Explore how to maintain a healthy lifestyle.
- Consider the link between a healthy lifestyle and mental wellbeing.
- Understand the science and opinions around blood, organ and stem cell donation.

Term 6:

## **Respectful relationships and families**

- Explore the difference between sexual violence and sexual harassment.
- Understand the different behaviours found within relationships.
- Consider how the law views marriage.

Term 1:

## **Mental wellbeing**

- A clear focus on various mental health issues.
- Explore the positive and negative ways of dealing with emotions.
- Understand how our own actions can impact our mental wellbeing.

Term 2:

## **The Media**

- Explore the link between mental health and the media.
- Consider the impact of digital footprints.
- Explore the effects of pornography.
- Understand how the media depicts sex and consider this in terms of the law.

Term 3:

## **Economics**

- Consider the importance of pensions.
- Understand the difference between renting and a mortgage.
- Explore and practice budgeting.

Term 4:

## **Human Rights**

- Explore different areas of the world and how they view human rights.

Term 5:

## **Health Prevention**

- Understand the importance and process of self-examination.
- Consider the debates around vaccination and immunization.
- Explore how to keep high levels of personal hygiene.

Term 6

## **Intimate Sexual Relationships**

- Explore the different sexually transmitted infections.
- Consider the relationship between drugs, alcohol and sex.
- Understand the impact of pornography.
