

Offences against the **person**, e.g. homicide, rape, robbery, assault Offences against **property**, e.g. theft, burglary, fraud Offences against the **State** or **Crown**, e.g. tax evasion, terrorism, immigration offences


**Participatory** offences, e.g. where a person has encouraged or assisted a criminal
