
Nuclear Weapons

A **nuclear weapon** uses nuclear reaction to cause massive damage to a large area killing lots of people.

Nuclear weapons have only been used once in history. They were dropped on the city of Hiroshima, Japan by the USA in 1945 Reasons for the use of nuclear weapons

Reasons against the use of nuclear weapons

- •Stop other countries from using them on the U.K.
- •We might need to use them in the future
- They go against pacifist ideas.
- They are seen as a waste of money
- They harm innocent civilian





Pacifism

Pacifism is the belief that violence is wrong and must never be used. There are two types of pacifist:

Absolute pacifists believe that violence can never be used for any reason

Conditional pacifists believe that violence is sometimes acceptable, for example in self defence



believed as a Hindu that we should never harm other people.

Through his pacifist teachings Gandhi wa able to liberate India from British rule in 1948



As a Cristian, Martin Luther King Jr. Was also a pacifist. He believed that Jesus was peaceful and so that we should also be peaceful

He protested using peaceful methods in order to achieve equality for people of colour in the USA
